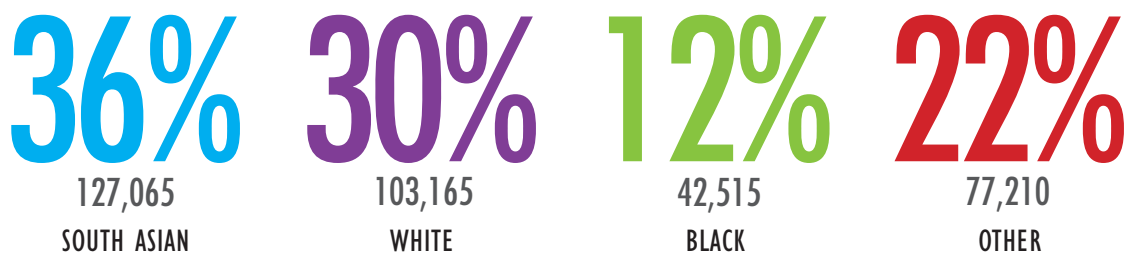

Statistics Canada collects data on visible minorities that describe population. The population break down by visible minority group provided here is for the Region of Peel for population aged 0-19.

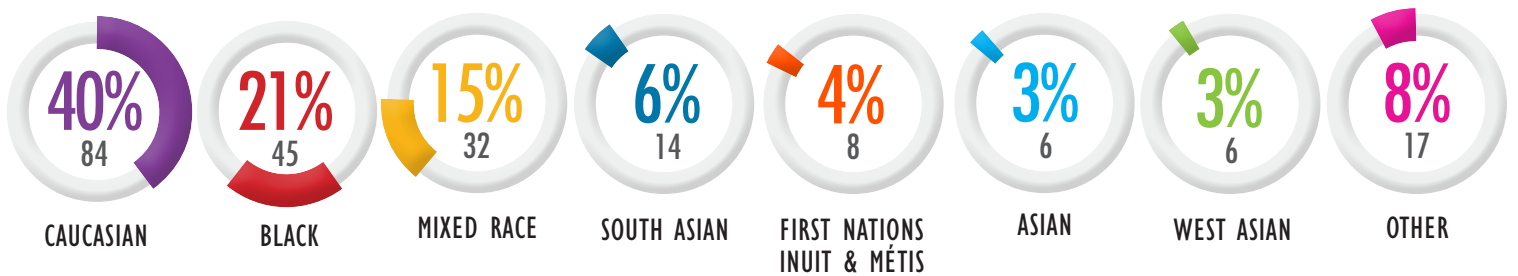

Identity of children and youth in the care of Peel CAS

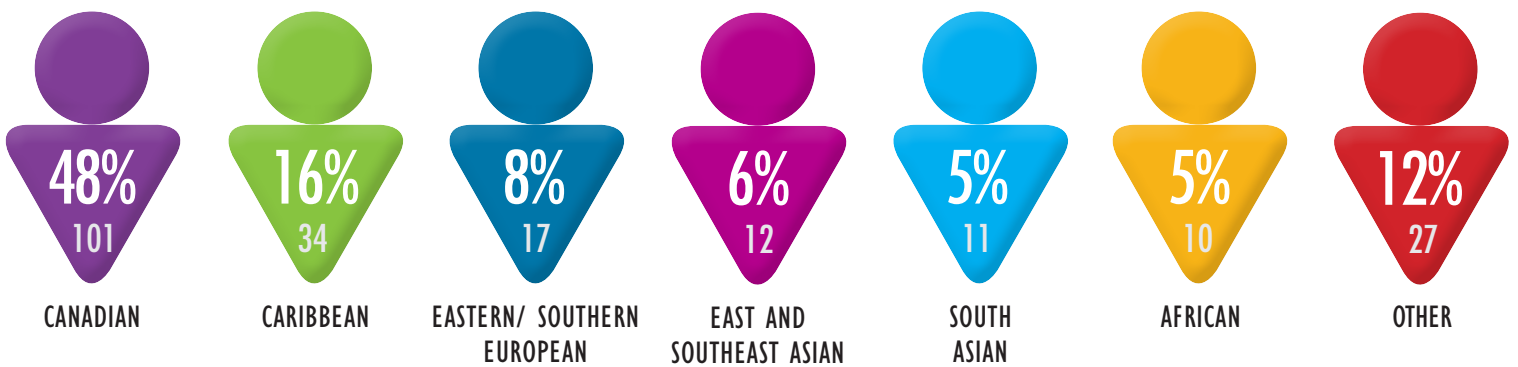
As of January 1, 2019 there were 212 children and youth in care of Peel CAS
